About us

Our story

The Alliance Française San Diego is a 501(c)(3) not-for-profit organization incorporated in the State of California.

Founded in 1927, Alliance Française San Diego is one of the oldest chapters in the United States. It is a cultural and educational association headed by a Franco-American team composed of instructors, a management team, and a Board of Directors.

In 2009, the Alliance Française de San Diego opened its first physical location on Lusk Boulevard in Sorrento Valley under the leadership of Anne-Laure Le Révérend, with His Eminence, Ambassador Pierre Vimont, and David Martignon, Consul General of France in Los Angeles. In September 2022, we had to close this facility for multiple reasons, including new ownership who wanted to destroy the building.









Our board

Five Francophones and Francophiles serve on the board. Two new members have recently joined, replacing two who left. Their goal is to engage the community and spark interest in our cultural and educational mission.

Our admin staff

Julie Ripoll, Executive Director; Amélie Chappaz, Educational Director; Laurence de Valmy, cultural coordinator; and Perrine Dellicour, certification coordinator, are part of the administrative team. They are all part-time and promote our mission by developing programs that fit the needs of our community at large.





Our teachers

Our teachers all work part-time at the Alliance as they have other jobs in universities or schools. We have a team of 18 teachers. They are native speakers, francophones, or close to native speakers, and all are certified to teach French as a second language (FLE Français Langue Etrangère).









Our teachers

Two teachers, without FLE diplomas, specialize in thematic classes, such as art or cooking, as they are Francophone and experts in their respective fields.




Now that we have a dedicated teacher, Perrine Dellicour, handling the certification coordination, we were able to offer four sessions of DELF/DALF (Scolaire, Junior, and two for adults) compared to three last year, as well as one DAEFLE session.

Once again, we hosted our DELF Scolaire at the Language Academy, a public dual immersion school, in partnership with the Alliance Française de Pasadena.



We handled 103 certifications: an increase of 50 % vs 2022 Repartition of type of certifications






Culture and Events



In 2023, the AFSD organized 69 events, nearly the same number as in 2022. However, these events attracted 1.515 attendees. almost triple participation of the previous year. The events included the French Film Club, hikes, the Book Club, Art Talks, the San Diego French Film Festival, La Soirée Francophone, La Nuit des Idées, and many more. Additionally, 23 online events offered by the Fédération des Alliances Françaises USA were attended by 113 guests, expanding the virtual offerings available to our community. To support these efforts, the cultural coordinator was given additional hours.

90% of our guests attended in-person events. Online events include lectures organized by the Federation des Alliances Françaises USA.

Over three days, from June 11 to June 13, 339 people joined us at The Lot in La Jolla.


On June 11, 183 attendees came for the opening, featuring the U.S. premiere of "The Astronaut", directed by Nicolas Giraud. Community





Our community continues to grow, increasing from 171 members in December 2022 to 275 in December 2023.

The website attracted 14K unique visitors for a reach of 23K. On social media, we connected with more than 8.5K + followers* for 60 K+ points of contacts through different platforms. We reactivated the Youtube channel, and reached 1.1 K views. The newsletter increased both in reach and attractivity.


















Community

Your membership helps the AFSD promote the French language and francophone cultures in San Diego.






Finances



The net income is positive, and we plan to open a new facility in San Diego despite the increased rent costs in the area.

We are also able to set aside some funds as a reserve for the cost that may happen when we open a new school.

Repartition of revenue by sources




Total expenses amounted to \$264,654, largely due to offering more classes and experiencing higher attendance at our events. This represents a 28.63% increase compared to 2022. Our occupancy expenses are significantly lower since we closed our facility and plan to reopen a new one in 2024. In the meantime, we are renting spaces for classes in various locations.

Total revenue was \$314,229, representing a net increase of 50.11% compared to 2022.

Classes were the primary source of revenue, accounting for 71%, followed by fundraising and events, which contributed 11% and 10% of the AFSD's income, respectively.
